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Choreographer and Artist Bios.

Maud Bryt is a New York based sculptor and painter who explores the relationship of form to form and color to color. She is thrilled to have this chance to collaborate on a dance which incorporates a sculpture, and a sculpture which incorporates a dance.

Julia K. Gleich is a contemporary ballet choreographer and teacher with over 25 years experience including 15 years in the UK at Trinity Laban, and London Studio Centre as Head of Choreography. Her company Gleich Dances has performed in the UK and US since 1995. Gleich received an Arts Council England Grant, a University of Utah Distinguished Alumni Award, a DanceOneUK Choreographer Observership with English National Ballet, and has produced CounterPointe since 2011. She writes about dance with Molly Faulkner: forthcoming chapter in the Oxford Handbook of Contemporary Ballet.

Anna Hymas lives and works in London. She trained as a dancer and then studied at Central St Martins College of Art and Design graduating in 2000. She has shown her paintings in London, New York, Glasgow, Paris, The Royal Academy Summer Exhibition as well as with other galleries throughout the UK. Anna is also a published children's book author, illustrator and has illustrated posters for the London Underground.

Margaret Lanzetta is a New York-based artist using abstract, culturally significant pattern to explore larger issues of language, political power, spirituality, and migration. Lanzetta divides her studio time between New York and various international cities.

Niki Lederer is a sculptor working with found materials including discarded umbrellas and post-consumer plastic. She recently formed BalletFolk, exploring the rich traditions of storytelling in ballet and folk music.
