At times a comedy and others a tragedy, the plot resides in a patriarchal society in which the role of women is constantly thwarted and limited by male dominance. However, Shakespeare's female characters contradict the gender mores of the period. These strong, grounded women display thoughtful judgment and compassionate morality. This solo, lifted from the evening-length work, depicts Hermione, the Queen of Sicilia, pleading her case against her husband's false accusation of infidelity with his best friend.
